Publication Policy

The International Journal for Business Law Studies (Hereinafter referred to as the “Journal”) is a double-blind, peer-reviewed journal, mainly contributing towards the expansion of research base in all the areas of Business Laws. All the manuscripts submitted to the Board of Editors will be peer reviewed by eminent scholars, practicing lawyers and professors. However, the same is subject to the discretion of the Journal due to other criterion involved in the selection process.

All the works shall be free from plagiarism. The maximum allowed limit for plagiarism is 10%, beyond which, the manuscript shall be immediately withdrawn from the selection process. This is because this journal expects the contributors to abide by academic integrity and intellectual honesty. Papers submitted for publication should be original.

Papers which are already published in other journals, anthologies etc., should not be submitted for publication. If this is found to be the case, it would lead to an immediate disqualification of the manuscript. If the same manuscript is published, then it shall be removed subsequent to the discovery of its existence elsewhere without notifying the author. The final discretion as to the acceptance of the manuscript’s rests with the Board of Editors of the Journal.

The Journal shall be the sole copyright owner of all the published materials. Apart from fair dealing for the purposes of research, private study or critique, no part of the journal shall be copied, adapted, abridged, translated or stored in any retrieval system, computer system, photographic or other system or reproduced in any form by any means whether electronic, mechanical, digital, optical, photographic or otherwise without prior written permission from the Journal. The authors are also required to fill and submit a copyright form in the same regard along with the acceptance of publication.

Every proposal submitted for publication is read at least by an editor, for an initial review. If the paper agrees with editorial policies and with a minimum quality level, is sent further to another editor. This stage compulsorily involves the Senior Editors of the Journal. The Editors won't know the author's identity, as the manuscript shall not contain any information which indicates the identity of the author or his affiliations (the same is mentioned in the Guidelines for the Manuscripts).

The Editor’s comments for the second stage of the process and the comments received during the second stage are confidential and before passing on to the author will made anonymous. Based on the comments, the Editorial Board makes a final decision on the acceptability of the manuscript, and communicates to the authors the decision, along with some changes or comments as required (if any). Where significant revisions are proposed, acceptance is dependent on whether the author can deal with those satisfactorily.

Role of Editors: The role of the editors is to evaluate the suitability of submitted manuscripts for the journal, including: (a) the quality of the manuscript, (b) whether it meets the Aims and Scope of the journal, and (c) the originality of the work. The editors will not disclose information about a submitted manuscript to anyone other than the corresponding author, or other members of the editorial board. Editors will ensure the prompt handling of the review process. Editors will evaluate the merit of manuscripts for intellectual content without regard to race, gender, country of origin, ethnicity, religion, or sexual orientation. They shall follow the guidelines laid down for the selection process in totality and shall not bring any personal bias to affect the review process.

Role of Authors: Authors of original research (not previously published or under consideration for publication elsewhere) should be an accurate presentation of the work carried out, a discussion of the significance of the work in context with previous works, and should contain sufficient detail to allow others to replicate the work. Appropriate citation of previously published works must always be included. Authors should disclose any financial or other conflicts of interest that may be construed as influencing the data or interpretation. Authorship should be only 2 people. If an author discovers a significant error in the published work, the author is obligated to inform the journal editor in order to either correct or retract the paper.

At the end reviewer(s) can recommend necessary corrections needed to accept the paper, if they are actually required, else recommend it for publication. If found unsuitable the paper should be declared as unacceptable for publication.

Sources of Contributions: Journal would seek to invite contributions from eminent legal luminaries, academicians, practitioners, students and scholars on a prior notified topic. The Journal also accepts submissions on the basis on its Call-for-Papers. The guidelines for these submissions are also enumerated. Additionally, the Journal may also solicit contributions.

This is a Bi-annual Journal and it will release 2 issues per year. This journal started from July, 2020.

Plagiarism - There is a zero-tolerance policy towards plagiarism in our journal. Manuscripts are screened for plagiarism before, during, and after publication, and if found they will be rejected at any stage of processing. The maximum allowed limit for plagiarism is 10%.
